There are a number of exciting events — eight workshops, demonstrations, technical exhibits, poster sessions, entrepreneurial events, graduate and undergraduate forums, mentoring sessions for students, women in engineering, and a specific industry-academia research track as well.

While the above is likely to whet the technical appetite of the participants, enthusiasts in the organizing team have incorporated a component to enable physical well-being as well, in the form of the COMSNETS 2025 5K Run, where everyone is invited to run, walk, or stroll in an attempt to keep us a bit more mobile. This nascent tradition emerged last year and we hope to keep it going in the years to come. Finally, there are a number of casual social events planned, including the welcome reception, the banquet (replete with a musical band), and the "chai" breaks to strengthen old friendships and forge new ones.
